Dear church family,

It was many years ago that I found myself walking the streets of La Chona,



Mexico. My dad, two brothers, two sisters, and mother would all take a couple hours each week to visit neighborhoods and present others with the Gospel of Jesus. There was one day that stands out in my mind, as a day of revelation. What was revealed to me in a sobering way was the great importance of knowing the teaching of Scriptures clearly so as to not be swayed by false teachings. It was on this day that my dad and I visited a home where there were Jehovah's Witnesses.

Greetings!

Last month we sang the wonderful song "Jesus, Lover Of My Soul" in several worship services. Did you recognize the tune the first time you heard it? Probably not. But you may have



recognized the words, which have appeared in thousands of hymnals. I think they are some of the best ever penned on the subject of trials and tribulations in the Christian life. However, none of the tunes with which they have traditionally been linked (there have been several over the years) have suited them very well, in my opinion. The one that is in our hymnbook, for example, doesn't seem quite right for the content of the lyrics, nor is it very well-known to our congregation, as I understand it.

The setting we have been using, by Kevin Twit, is a relatively new one – copyright 2000, with the original words (written in 1739 by Charles Wesley) remaining intact. It can be found on the first "Indelible Grace" album. In case you're not aware, Indelible Grace is an artist collective (not to be confused with Sovereign Grace) based in Nashville, Tennessee, that has led a movement to restore the historic practice of writing new melodies to old hymn texts. This community of songwriters and musicians grew out of the Reformed University Fellowship at Belmont University. Kevin Twit was the RUF campus minister at the time of its formation in 1999, and he still holds that position to this day.

There are currently nine Indelible Grace albums. The official website of the collective (igracemusic.com) contains information about their recordings, as well as free sheet music for their entire hymnbook (over 200 songs) and other resources. Our own musical repertoire list at FBCOY actually contains one other Indelible Grace song besides the one we've been singing – "On Jordan's Stormy Banks." I hope to use more of their hymn settings in worship in the future, if opportunities to do so present themselves. If you enjoy hearing new versions of old hymns, I would encourage you to explore the Indelible Grace website or listen to any of their albums for free at *bandcamp.com*.

June 17th Council Meeting

- Council looked at the church's insurance policy and decided to switch to a new policy as there seemed to be several gaps with the old policy. The new insurance premium would be \$8633 per year and will include sexual abuse and counseling insurance for officers and pastors. A civil rights coverage will be approximately \$700 more. The Council approved the change to Longley insurance asking if we could pay quarterly.
- Dave L. will need to get his own insurance for the use of the gym and it should name FBCOY as an additional insured.
- The York Home School Association already has additional insurance.
- Property is still waiting on the HVAC part for the heat exchanger on the roof.
- Mold has been found in the resource room.
- The restrooms in the Gathering Place need repairs.
- Ants have been found in the downstairs kitchen. It is important that groups wipe off counters and mop up the floor after an event.
- Robert M. was approved for church membership.
- Filene G. hosted a yard sale to help raise funds for one of our families in need.

- Pastor Rey and Mercedes met with Leroy T. to see how we can help them raise funds. They need about \$10,000 per month to go but can still go if they raise 80 percent of what they need. Their plan is to go next year.
- The Piercing Word presentation has been moved to September 8th. They will now be doing a musical called <u>The Sermon on the Mount</u>. Please invite people to come to this family event.
- Friend Sunday has been rescheduled to October 6th.
- The Sunday service in the park will be scheduled for fall 2024.
- Education will be discussing the Bible Recap check-up in the fall as well as VBS. They will be meeting with the pastor to get his thoughts on where the Education Ministry Team should focus their efforts.
- Security cameras are being installed. There is a plan to buy additional cameras.
- The technology team is considering moving to Google for emails and other benefits. This would be a cost of \$900/year. This is still being considered.
- Pastor Rey would like to move the communion service to the end of the month. The purpose for this change is that the pastor plans to emphasize the concepts taught throughout the month and provide a specific segment of his sermon on The Lord's Table. Council approved this change. Pastor Rey hopes to have communion twice in July as we switch the timing for communion.
- During the month of July the pastor will be preaching on doctrines that distinguish.



By your Holy Spirit's power we embrace Jesus as our Savior through His blood that has purchased us from our sins that we confess to Him.


Thank you for His finished work on the cross and the empty tomb that has sealed our eternal pardon that gives us hope.




