Greetings! Last month, I discussed the progress I've made over the past year in going through the church's established musical repertoire. Now, I'd like to provide a list and brief description of the new songs that were introduced over the past year. Since all these songs (with the



exception of one) came straight from the repertoire list I was originally given, there have actually been no new songs of my own choosing. Still, these songs were new to most of you at the time of their introduction in worship services. So, I thought it would be valuable to document them: (1) "Build My Life" – made popular by one of its songwriters, Pat Barrett, in a 2018 recording; currently sitting at #5 on the CCLI Top 100 chart, (2) "The Lion And The Lamb" – recorded by one of its songwriters, Brenton Brown, in 2017 but made popular by both Big Daddy Weave and Leeland in 2016; currently #46 on CCLI, (3) "Great Reward" – written by yours truly at the request of our education committee to assist in the memorization of Psalm 19, (4) "King Of Kings" – made popular through a 2019 recording by Hillsong Worship; currently #17 on CCLI, and (5) "O Praise The Name (Anastasis)" – made popular through a 2015 recording by Hillsong Worship; currently #37 on CCLI.

There were also a few traditional hymns that we did in the past year that could possibly be considered "new" because they seemed to be unfamiliar to many. Two of those, which we have repeated fairly recently, are "Praise, My Soul, The King of Heaven" and "May The Mind Of Christ, My Savior." In addition, there were a few contemporary songs that were used only once in services, which were among those that I originally assumed were part of the established repertoire, and later realized were not: "God So Loved," "House Of The Lord," and "Always." We may return to them at some point. Any other songs that seemed like new songs were actually done before (many years ago in some cases). It is my hope and prayer that each of our worship songs is a source of blessing to you both on Sundays and throughout each week.

## **April 15th Council Meeting**

- **†** A suggested new policy for dealing with inactive members was presented to the Council. They tabled further discussion of this topic until everyone had time to read and pray about the change.
- **†** Daryl has spoken with Dave L. about insurance and a waiver for participants when using the gym.
- † It was decided at this point to not renew the Zoom software for the church until it may be needed.
- **†** Church finances were discussed. Council members were asked to have their budget requests for next year to Justin by the end of April.
- **†** The Camp Hebron bill will be paid at the tier 3 level.
- **†** We will be holding Breaker Rock Beach VBS on August 8-10th.
- **†** Council would like to encourage people to participate in the Pennsylvania Bible Reading Marathon. A group plans to go to Harrisburg for a time of participation and fellowship.
- **†** The Women's Ministry group will be meeting on May 5th to discuss future events.
- **†** We will not be having a graduation Sunday this year as none of our congregation is graduating this year.
- **†** We are still waiting for a part to repair the HVAC unit for the sanctuary.
- **†** An estimate was gotten and approved to have the floor in the gymnasium reglued as needed, tape residue removed and the surface buffed.
- † Ilene has agreed to look at reupholstering the chair cushions in the Serenity Place.
- **†** The mowing crew has started mowing the church lawn. Mulch has been spread around the trees and flowerbeds on the church property.

- † There was discussion about the amount of work needed to adequately clean the church building. It was mentioned that members from our congregation and the Bhutanese congregation may be willing to regularly clean part of the building to allow more time for the custodian to do further cleaning.
- **†** Pastor Raju's laptop and Pastor Rey's phone have disappeared from the church building and the building was found unlocked. If these items are not located, the church will file a police report.
- **†** Sheryl H. was reinstated as a member.
- **†** Wendy S. has joined the Member Care Ministry Team.
- **†** Pastor Rey will pick up visitation and communion visits with shut-ins when he is able.
- **†** The Member Care Ministry Team is currently working with three families within our congregation to help them in various areas.
- **†** The Outreach Ministry Team would like to host Piercing the Word ministries in June. Mercedes and the pastor will look into this further.
- **†** The Mission Training Bible Study has been scheduled for June 8th with Rev. Mark Mahserjian-Smith.
- **†** We are still looking for a good way to translate the web site to Spanish.
- **†** The security team is planning to install security cameras in May.
- **†** There was discussion about moving ahead with the plan to rekey the church building.
- **†** Joel is considering changing the church's email over to google.
- † There was discussion on how to do further follow-up with visitors. The pastor and Outreach team will discuss this. There was also discussion about a need

for more seats to be added back into the sanctuary and for ushers to help visitors find available seats.

- **†** The next Church Council meeting is scheduled for May 20th at 7:00pm.






Heavenly Father,




